Zimba Kabuynjo project.

The “Zimba Kabuynjo” or “help a family build a pit latrine” project is expected to benefit about 529 families; that is approximately 3000 people to benefit from the project in three different communities. The vision is to improve the sanitation and hygiene levels of many families and also to reduce the high rate of disease outbreak and other ill-health related issues. The main mission of this project is to establish a modern community which enjoys good health, which in return will improve family savings and income levels since there will be less expenses on medication and treatment in hospitals/health centres.

You can donate £40 or more; then send a picture of your toilet at home so that after the project is successfully carried out we can twin your toilet and a pit latrine or latrines you fundraised for and then we can send you the picture of your twinned latrine.

“Before joining FAL classes I used to cultivate my plantation using local methods of farming and my harvest was too poor, after a few months when I got involved in FAL classes’ I learnt a lot of new skills and better farming methods.
